





fantastic, palatial space of indulgence and dreams. This environment comes into its own as the sun goes down, crystals glitter and satin gleams.

















LIGHTING


These luxury environments are stage lit with glorious spotlights and drama. Sensual choreography creates light-scapes that excite and enhance. In this ex-
